Sec. 742,371 SECTION 3. Section 742.371 of the Revised Code is presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended by both Am. Sub. H.B. 383 and Sub. H.B. 394 of the 119th General Assembly, with the new language of neither of the acts shown in capital letters. Section 3307.01 of the Revised Code is presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended by both Am. Sub. H.B. 180 and Sub. H.B. 382 of the 119th General Assembly, with the new language of neither of the acts shown in capital letters. Section 3309.39 of the Revised Code is presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended by both Sub. S.B. 182 and Sub. S.B. 240 of the 118th General Assembly, with the new language of neither of the acts shown in capital letters. This is in recognition of the principle stated in division (B) of section 1.52 of the Revised Code that such amendments are to be harmonized where not substantively irreconcilable and constitutes a legislative finding that such is the resulting version in effect prior to the effective date of this act.

SECTION 4. Section 742.371 of the Revised Code is amended by this act and also by Sub. H.B. 394 of the 119th General Assembly, effective August 3, 1992. The amendments of Sub. H.B. 394 are included in this act in lower case to confirm the inention to retain them, but are not intended to be effective until August 3, 1992.

SECTION 5. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is that immediate action is needed to amend state retirement laws due to enactment of the federal "Older Workers Benefit Protection Act of 1990." which requires that state retire-

ment systems amend by October 16, 1992, any disability benefit law that discriminates among system members on the basis of age. Therefore, this act shall go into immediate effect.
