Payment to member who ceases to be a public employee; forfeiture.

Sec. 145.40. A member who ceases to be a public employee for any cause other than death or retirement, and subject to such rules and regulations as are established by the public employees retirement board, upon application to the board *** shall be paid the accumulated contributions standing to the credit of his individual account in the employees' savings fund, and in addition thereto, he shall be refunded any principal payment he may have made to restore previously forfeited service credit as provided in section 145.31 of the Revised Code, provided three months have elapsed since his public service was terminated and providing he has not returned to public service during said three-month period and, further providing, he is not a member of either the school employees retirement system or the state teachers retirement system. *** The

payment of such accumulated contributions shall cancel the total service credit of such member in the public employees retirement system.

Section 3. Any member, eligible for any of the retirement allowances or other benefits provided in Chapters 145., 3307., and 3309. of the Revised Code as of June 30, 1959, or July 1, 1959, and who terminated his public service during the month of June, 1959, but did not file an application for retirement, may file, as provided by law, during the month of July, 1959, and shall be eligible for retirement as of June 30, 1959, or July 1, 1959, and such allowances or benefits shall be payable from and after July 1, 1959, and any such member or any member retiring on June 30, 1959, or July 1, 1959, voluntarily or otherwise, shall be eligible for allowances or benefits as computed under the provisions of this act.

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
