Sec. 171.02. MEETINGS OF THE OHIO RETIREMENT STUDY COMMISSION SHALL BE CALLED IN SUCH MANNER AND AT SUCH TIMES AS PRESCRIBED BY RULES ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSION. A MAJORITY OF THE COMMISSION CONSTITUTES A QUORUM AND NO ACTION SHALL BE TAKEN BY THE COMMISSION UNLESS APPROVED BY AT LEAST FIVE VOTING MEMBERS. THE COMMISSION SHALL ORGANIZE BY SELECTING A CHAIRMAN, VICE-CHAIRMAN, AND SUCH OTHER OFFICERS AS IT DEEMS NECESSARY. THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF ITS BUSINESS AND THE ELECTION OF ITS OFFICERS, AND SHALL ESTABLISH AN OFFICE IN COLUMBUS. EACH MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION, BEFORE ENTERING UPON HIS OFFICIAL DUTIES SHALL TAKE AND SUBSCRIBE TO AN OATH OF OFFICE, TO UPHOLD THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES AND THIS STATE AND TO PERFORM THE DUTIES OF HIS OFFICE HONESTLY, FAITHFULLY, AND IMPARTIALLY. MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SHALL SERVE WITHOUT COMPENSATION BUT SHALL BE REIMBURSED FOR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES.

SECTION 23. The text of section 171.02 of the Revised Code, as results from its repeal and reenactment by this act, is intended to confirm that, pursuant to Section 5 of Am. Sub. H.B. 706 of the 116th General Assembly, the amendments made to the section by Am. H.B. 647 of the 116th General Assembly are to have no force or effect. The text of the section as results from its repeal and reenactment is therefore identical to the text of the section as resulted from S.B. 269 of the 108th General Assembly, except for the deletion of provisions that have become obsolete.
