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Sec. 3307.21. (A) The treasurer of state shall furnish annually to the state teachers retirement board a sworn statement of the amount of the funds in his custody belonging to the state teachers retirement system.

(B)(1) AS USED IN THIS DIVISION, "PERSONAL HISTORY RECORD" MEANS INFORMATION MAINTAINED BY THE BOARD ON A MEMBER, FORMER MEMBER, CONTRIBUTOR, FORMER CONTRIBUTOR, RETIRANT, OR BENEFICIARY THAT INCLUDES THE ADDRESS, TELEPHONE NUMBER, SOCIAL SE-CURITY NUMBER, RECORD OF CONTRIBUTIONS, CORRE-SPONDENCE WITH THE SYSTEM, OR OTHER INFORMATION THE BOARD DETERMINES TO BE CONFIDENTIAL.

(2) The records of the board shall be open to public inspection, except for the following, which shall be excluded, EXCEPT WITH THE WRIT-TEN AUTHORIZATION OF THE INDIVIDUAL CONCERNED: the

(a) THE INDIVIDUAL'S personal records provided for in section 3307.29 of the Revised Code, the member's;

(b) THE INDIVIDUAL'S personal history record, and any;

(c) ANY information identifying, by name and address, the amount of a monthly allowance or benefit paid to a retirant, beneficiary, or survivor, except with the written authorization of the individual concerned. All

(C) ALL medical reports and recommendations under sections 3307.42, 3307.44, and 3307.49 of the Revised Code are privileged, except that copies of such medical reports or recommendations shall be made available to the personal physician, attorney, or authorized agent of the member INDIVIDUAL CONCERNED upon written release received from the member HIM or his agent, or, when necessary for the proper administration of the fund, to the board assigned physician.

(D) Any PERSON WHO IS A member OR CONTRIBUTOR of the system shall be furnished with a statement of the amount to the credit of his individual account upon HIS written request by the member. The board need not answer more than one request of a member PERSON in any one year.

(E) NOTWITHSTANDING THE EXCEPTIONS TO PUBLIC IN-SPECTION IN DIVISION (B)(2) OF THIS SECTION, THE BOARD MAY FURNISH THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

(1) IF A MEMBER, FORMER MEMBER, RETIRANT, CONTRI-BUTOR, OR FORMER CONTRIBUTOR IS CONVICTED OF OR PLEADS GUILTY TO A VIOLATION OF SECTION 2921.41 OF THE REVISED CODE, ON WRITTEN REQUEST OF A PROSECUTOR AS DEFINED IN SECTION 2935.01 OF THE REVISED CODE, THE BOARD SHALL FURNISH TO THE PROSECUTOR THE INFORMA-TION REQUESTED FROM THE INDIVIDUAL'S PERSONAL HIS-TORY RECORD.

(2) PURSUANT TO A COURT ORDER ISSUED UNDER SEC-TION 3113.21 OF THE REVISED CODE, THE BOARD SHALL FUR-NISH TO A COURT OR CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT AGEN-CY THE INFORMATION REQUIRED UNDER THAT SECTION.

(3) AT THE WRITTEN REQUEST OF ANY PERSON, THE BOARD SHALL PROVIDE TO THE PERSON A LIST OF THE NAMES AND ADDRESSES OF MEMBERS, FORMER MEMBERS, RETIRANTS, CONTRIBUTORS, FORMER CONTRIBUTORS, OR BENEFICIARIES. THE COSTS OF COMPILING, COPYING, AND MAILING THE LIST SHALL BE PAID BY SUCH PERSON.

(4) The board shall furnish the director of the Ohio student loan commission with the information required under division (A) of section 3351.071 of the Revised Code.

(5) Within fourteen days after receiving from the director of human services a list of the names and social security numbers of recipients of public assistance pursuant to section 5101.181 of the Revised Code, the board shall inform the auditor of state of the name, current or most recent employer address, and social security number of each member whose name and social security number are the same as that of a person whose name or social security number was submitted by the director. The board and its employees shall, except for purposes of furnishing the auditor of state with information required by this section, preserve the confidentiality of recipients of public assistance in compliance with division (A) of section 5101.181 of the Revised Code.

(F) A STATEMENT THAT CONTAINS INFORMATION OB-TAINED FROM THE SYSTEM'S RECORDS THAT IS SIGNED BY AN OFFICER OF THE RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND TO WHICH THE SYSTEM'S OFFICIAL SEAL IS AFFIXED, OR COPIES OF THE SYSTEM'S RECORDS TO WHICH THE SIGNATURE AND SEAL ARE ATTACHED, SHALL BE RECEIVED AS TRUE COPIES OF THE SYSTEM'S RECORDS IN ANY COURT OR BEFORE ANY OFFICER OF THIS STATE.

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
