## Board of trustees.

Sec. 742.03. The administration, control, and management of the police and firemen's disability and pension fund, created under section 742.02 of the Revised Code, is vested in a board of trustees of the police and firemen's disability and pension fund, which shall consist of seven members as follows:
(A) The attorney general;
(B) The auditor of state;
(C) The fiscal officer of a municipal corporation who shall be appointed by the governor, within sixty days after the effective date of this act, for a term ending on the first Monday in June, 1968, and thereafter a successor shall be appointed by the governor for a term of three years.
(D) Four members known as employee members, two of whom shall be members of the fund who are employees of a police department of a municipal corporation, who shall be elected by ballot by the members of the fund who are employees of police departments of a municipal corporation and two of whom shall be members of the fund who are employees of a fire department of a municipal corporation or a township who shall be elected by ballot by the members of the fund who are employees of fire departments of municipal corporations or townships, except that the first members of the board representing employees of police departments shall be appointed by the governor, within sixty days after the effective date of this section, for terms ending on the first Monday in June, 1967, and the first Monday in June, 1969, and the first members of the board representing employees of fire departments shall be appointed by the governor, within sixty days after the effective date of this act, for terms ending on the first Monday in June, 1968, and the first Monday in June, 1970.

At the expiration of the term of an employee member of the board appointed by the governor his successor shall be elected for a term of four years as provided by section 742.04 of the Revised Code. (Enacted in Amended House Bill No. 642)
